The Pre-Kindergarten theme is traveling. The students will all have a Pre-K passport. The students receive stickers for their passports whenever we "travel". This occurs every few weeks. We visit places like Farmington, The South Pole, Beachville, Movement Town, and Bethlehem. Each place has a unique theme and the learning centers around that theme while we are "visiting".
