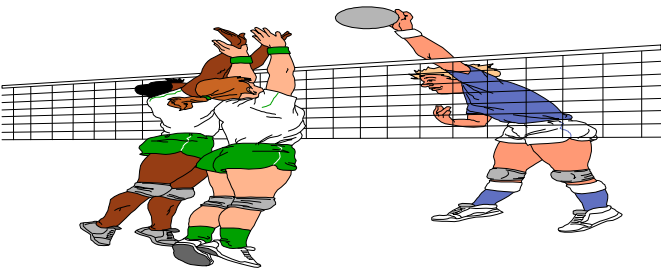
CHAPEL
