HONDURAS MEDICAL MISSION TRIP

The medical missions team from the Raymond Foundation was in Honduras for seven days and saw 3,300 patients. The team consisted of 8 doctors, 5 nurses, 6 translators and 9 helpers. The helpers assisted the pharmacy and ran patients between nurse triage, the doctors and the pharmacy. The team took \$10,000 worth of medications with them. Any medications that were not used were left with a local clinic in a very poor neighborhood called the Ruth Paz Clinic. The team saw diseases of all sorts - infections, arthritis, back problems, congenital heart disease parasites and malnutrition. Thank you so much for your chapel offerings in January. Donations like yours make this trip possible to help these truly needy ones from Honduras.
