FLU SEASON

The flu season is upon us! The symptoms for influenza A (H1N1) are very similar to the seasonal flu. The symptoms are:

- High fever and body aches
- Lethargy, fatigue or lack of energy
- Lack of appetite
- Coughing and sore throat

Children should be kept at home until they have been 24 hours without any symptoms and/or fever reducing medication.

The best defense from getting the flu is good personal hygiene, including washing hands often, covering a cough or sneeze with a tissue and disposing of the tissue immediately, avoiding touching the eyes, mouth or nose and not sharing water bottles or utensils with others.

The Union County Health Department has the following clinic scheduled:

Thursday, Nov. 12 from 3:30-7pm at the old Marysville Middle School (Located by Marysville High School, 833 N. Maple St, Marysville)- Open to all 5 high risk groups:

- 1) Pregnant women (need letter from their doctor stating it is okay for them to receive H1N1 vaccination)
- 2) All healthcare workers and EMS workers with direct patient care
- 3) Caregivers and household contacts (parents, siblings and daycare providers) of children under age 6 months
- 4) Children age 6 months through 24
- 5) Adults age 25 through 64 with a chronic medical condition such as (asthma, heart disease, cancer, diabetes, morbid obesity, etc)

Cost: H1N1 vaccination is FREE.

ID Requirements: Pregnant women still need to provide a letter from their doctor indicating it is okay for them to receive an H1N1 vaccination. People in any of the other high risk groups do not need to show ID or proof of their high risk group.
